Our first CD, SING! PERFORM! AFFIRM! was completed in 2006 in honor of our 10th anniversary. Our 10th Anniversary LIVE! CD has just been released. We have established a small group ensemble called ENCORE! Each day brings new experiences and thrills to the choir and we are still having fun!
